Teachers are monitored on a regular basis and are provided with ongoing professional development. We will assess students' knowledge and improvements. In order to teach the whole child, students are offered Fine Arts, P.E./Health, computers, library, peer tutoring, after school tutoring, Character Education, counseling and After School Enrichment programs. We desire to provide structure and clear limits so that all children are treated in a fair manner. Floyd Elementary lunchroom staff will offer a well- balanced breakfast and lunch.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held: Parent-teacher conferences will be held throughout the school year using various methods for social distancing practices during agreed scheduled time to discuss student's progress
- 3. **Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.** Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows: Reports of student progress will be given through weekly papers sent home, daily contact with parents when students are picked up, mid weeks progress reports, nine week report cards, telephone calls and notes sent home by students.
