2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's

A General Open House meeting will be held during the month of August to inform parents of the child's expectation. One on one parent conferences will be scheduled by the classroom teacher during the first nine weeks of school. Parents may request conferences at any time to discuss the student's progress.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

Graded papers and conduct grades will be sent home weekly by the student. Progress Reports will be provided to all parents after four and a half weeks of school in all subjects and conduct by the student.

At the end of nine weeks the parents will receive grade report by the student.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

Communications between school and home, during planning time, and after school with a twenty four hour notice. Conferences can be in the office conference room, in an empty classroom, in the counselor's office or the principal's office.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

We have always had an open door policy that allows parents to observe in their child's class at any time other than testing. Parents are encouraged to be a part of their child's education and the school. Volunteers are invited to serve as mentors, readers, library helpers, peer helpers, set up for festivals, work during the festivals, help classroom teachers, run copies, serve on advisory boards, become members of PTO board, sit in classrooms, chaperone on field trips, speak at events, sing at programs, decorate for programs, and to utilize any other talents that they might have to serve the children.

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

Communication between the parents and staff be conducted through student folders and planners. Communication to parents will be in a way they can understand. Parent meetings and conferences will be held all year long and parents will be invited to all special events.
